<b>Job Title</b>	Public Works Summer Students – sixteen (16) week term
<b>Department</b>	Public Works Department
<b>Accountabilities</b>	<p>TOA is currently staffing up for its summer line painting program and is looking for motivated individuals to tackle various jobs, including night-time traffic line painting, traffic control jobs, and various maintenance activities for Town owned or maintained properties.</p> <p>As a member of our team, you will be responsible for ensuring your compliance with safe work methods and practices under the supervision of a member of Public Works crew, working closely with the Public Works, Electric Utility, and Treatment Facilities Divisions. You will be required to work effectively with your peers and perform the necessary physical labour duties as required. This accountability involves following safe work procedures and vehicle safety; reporting and learning from incidents; and engaging in group communications.</p>
<b>Skills, Capabilities and Experience</b>	<p>You should have / demonstrate proven communication skills, the flexibility and ability to adapt to rescheduled assignments, self-management skills, work ethic and a positive attitude. You will need to show proof of enrollment / return to a post-secondary educational institution and hold a valid Nova Scotia Class 5 Driver's License.</p> <p><b>Responsibilities</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Operates and assesses line painting equipment for operating and maintenance of equipment. Undertakes routine equipment maintenance as required.</li> <li>• Undertakes summer line painting and traffic control activities subject to the direction of the Public Works crew. Work is expected to require approximately 6-10 weeks of night work to complete line painting on high traffic streets.</li> <li>• Undertake training (provided by the Town) to gain certification in Traffic Control / Temporary Workplace Signage, WHMIS and First Aid.
